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## TRANSFER OF PENSION CREDITS

Employees who joined the Alberta Government service within the past year, and who had previously contributed to another registered pension plan in the public service field, may be able to transfer their previous pension credits to the Public Service Pension Plan and have their former service recognized as pensionable under the Alberta plan -- providing, of course, a refund of contributions was not received from their former employer.

Where there is a Reciprocal Transfer Agreement in effect with another pension authority, both employee and employer contributions and interest may be transferred to the pension plan of the new employer to effect a transfer of pension credits.

It should be noted, however, that certain restrictions and time limits exist for the transfer of credits under these agreements, and any delay in applying for a transfer may result in the application being denied.

At present the Public Service Pension Board has reciprocal agreements with the following pension authorities:
