SUBJECT MANAGEMENT PENSION PLAN

In 1982, after a fourteen year career with the Canadian Armed Forces, I contemplated a career change. I applied for and was interviewed for a management position with Alberta Solicitor General. I specifically asked during the process if my Armed Forces pension was transferable and I was told that it was.

In a subsequent letter of acceptance, dated 8 February 1982 and signed by [REDACTED], it was stated that "Your Federal Government pension contributions are transferable to the Alberta Government Management Pension Plan" (copy attached). Mr. W.C. Mulley, who was then the Director of the Calgary Correctional Centre, attended my interview and recalls the matter being discussed and has stated to me the subject of pension was discussed as it was normally a part of the interview process.

In March 1983, I was contacted by the Armed Forces and asked to arrange for the disposal of my pension funds. I notified Ms. Monique Proulx, the Personnel representative at the Calgary Correctional Centre, who informed me that there was no pension arrangement between the Canadian Armed Forces and the Government of Alberta and that my pension monies would not be accepted.

Recently, a Centre Personnel staff member who was conducting a file review, found a copy of my offer letter and, after enquiries on my behalf, encouraged me to pursue the matter.

\* I am therefore requesting that I be allowed to deposit the pension monies returned to me by the Armed Forces in 1983 with the Alberta Government Management Pension Plan. I am further requesting that upon the deposit of these monies that I be credited with 14 years of pensionable service with the Province of Alberta.

It is my contention that the Regional Director of Personnel, [REDACTED], erred in her offer letter and that this error, while it may be unintentional, constitutes a significant financial penalty to me.
